Wilder's 2018-2019 School Wide Learning Goals

Each school year the Wilder Data Team reviews student learning and various other data with the purpose of establishing data based student-learning goals. This process allows us to use data to inform our work as a learning community. This school year we will continue to focus on Literacy, Math and Student Engagement. Our school student-learning goals for this school year are as follows:

Math

Wilder Elementary School students will reach the 60th NCE on the Spring 2019 STAR math assessment.

50th NCE = The score that 50% of the students at a grade level score.

Literacy

Wilder students in grades 2-5 will attain a NCE score of 60 or higher on the Spring STAR Literacy. Wilder students in grades K-1 will attain a NCE score of 60 NCE or higher in the area of "Phonemic Awareness" on the Spring STAR Early Literacy Assessment.

50th NCE = The score that 50% of the students at a grade level score.

Student Engagement

Wilder K-5 staff will engage all students in the use of strategies around problem solving and kindness in order to increase staff and student Safety dimension scores to 3.00 or higher as measured by the annual School Climate Survey.

To accomplish these goals, the staff at Wilder will continue to meet in grade level/department teams on a weekly basis. These team meetings are designed for teachers to share strategies for student success. Each grade level/department also shares strategies at our monthly staff meetings and at the early release days. Continuous monitoring and feedback are also steps that we take to ensure that all students are experiencing success.

How Can You Help Our School and Your Child(ren) Meet Our Student Learning Goals

Home involvement is a critical component of a child's success in school. Reading at home with a child for 20 minutes a day can greatly increase a child's likelihood of being a proficient reader. One of the keys to this strategy is the involvement of another person with the child during the 20-minute reading time. This can be the child reading to another person, the other person reading to the child, or the child reading individually. The critical piece to the 20-minute reading time is the discussion between the child and the other person. This discussion can be questions that are asked before, during, and or after reading. Good questioning is a critical component of Wilder students reaching our building goal. Questions like - what was the best part of the book, if you were the character what would you do, and has something like this ever happened to you are great ways for a reader to develop the higher level thinking skills that we are working on in our school goal. Your continued effort is appreciated as we work together to ensure that all Wilder students become proficient lifelong readers. In math, the district has adopted a new math resource. Students will experience various ways of mathematical thinking to ensure their math success.

Dismissal

As a reminder, **Wilder School dismisses at 2:45**, please have arrangements made to pick up your children on time. There is no supervision after 3:00 pm. If children are left at school after 3:15 pm District policy is that the Police and/or Social Services need to be notified if parents cannot be contacted.

Student Emergency Cards: It is extremely important to fill out and sign the yellow emergency card for your child(ren) at the beginning of the year. The phone numbers and emergency contacts are often used when a student is ill or injured and we need to reach you. If you have not already filled one out, please request one from the office.

Students Absences

When your child(ren) are going to be absent from school. Please follow the procedure outline below;

1. You should call the school office when your child(ren) are going to be absent. Our voicemail is on when we are not in the office, so you can call in at any time.
2. If a student needs to leave school due to illness/appointment, he/she must have a note from home or a phone call to the office must be made. We will not excuse your child to leave until we have made contact with you or an emergency contact that you have listed on your child's emergency card.
3. If your child(ren) arrive to school late, please have them check in the office upon arrival so that attendance can be updated.

Be at School: Per State Law: A child may not miss more than 10 school days in one school year. Please communicate any issues your child(ren) may have due to chronic illness. If you are planning a family trip/vacation during the school year, please request a "pre-excused absence" form in advance.

Automated Calling: If you have not called in to excuse your child(ren) and they are marked absent, you will receive an automated call that morning alerting you of the absence. This system is completely computer automated so the office cannot control who gets these phone calls. Mistakes do sometimes happen during the taking of classroom attendance so if you believe your student has been marked absent by mistake, please call our office. If your child was in fact absent, you will be given an opportunity to leave a message after the automated call or you can call our office explaining the reason for your child(ren)'s absence. If you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to call the office. Attendance is a critical factor in school success!!!!
