Welcome back to what is sure to be another great school year at Wilder! I would like to take this opportunity to invite each family to become engaged and involved with the Wilder School Community as we work together to truly make a difference for our Wilder children.

**PBIS**

Welcome to the 2018-19 school year. We all look forward to a great school year and the many opportunities for learning that are ahead. This year Wilder will be in its 6th year of implementing the Positive Behavior Intervention and Support program, PBIS. PBIS is a program supported by the Green Bay Area School District to promote and maximize academic achievement and behavioral competence. This program is a school-wide strategy for helping all students achieve important social and learning goals. We know that when good behavior and good teaching come together, our students will excel in their learning. Many schools in the Green Bay area are proud to be a part of this exciting initiative.

During this 6th year of using the PBIS model, the staff and students at Wilder Elementary will focus on the following areas of the day; voice volume, hallway behavior, behavior in the commons during lunchtime, entering and exiting the building, bathroom behavior and playground behavior. One way students will be recognized for their positive behavior is through the use of Wolf Tickets which can be used toward future incentives. Other incentives for students with good behavior throughout the year will also be available!

At Wilder School, we are committed to creating a learning environment that will encourage positive behavior and interactions while discouraging problem behaviors. This approach is based on directly teaching students the behaviors we expect to see, reminding them to use those behaviors, acknowledging them when they do, correcting them when they do not, and celebrating their successes. The goal of PBIS is to create a positive school culture by reducing problem behavior and providing maximum academic time for students and staff. We ask for parents to support their child to make good choices.

We believe that by helping students practice good behavior, we will build a school community where all students have an environment where they can succeed and grow. Please take this opportunity to talk to your child about the expectations at school and the importance of continuing to demonstrate "WILDER WAY" behaviors (RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY and SAFETY). With your continued support and involvement, L.I. Wilder will remain a school where students can excel.

**Wilder School Hours**

Wilder school is open from 7:30am-3:30pm Monday through Friday. School starts at 8:12am and ends at 2:45pm. Students may arrive at 8:00am or 7:45am if they are participating in the school breakfast program. Any student that arrives before 7:50 am and is not in the breakfast program will not be supervised as our outside supervision starts at 7:50 am.

## **Morning Drop Off and After School Pick Up**

The morning drop of procedures at Wilder are as follows;

- 1). Students are not to arrive at Wilder before 7:45 am as we do not have supervision of students until 7:45 am.
- 2). Parents dropping students off can either park on Robinson Avenue to the west of the driveway leading to the staff parking lot or to the east of the exit driveway. Student/parents we then proceed on the sidewalks that lead to the landing pad between Robinson Avenue and the bus drive through. There student/parents will cross the bus drive through with our student safety patrols and staff members. Parents may also park on Radinz Avenue and crossover Robinson Avenue via the crossing guard.
- 3). If parents drop off students using the bus drive through - please enter the bus drive through using the westernmost driveway. Upon enter the drive through, please proceed with caution all the way to end of the drive through where the sign "Student Drop" off is located. After students are safely on the Wilder sidewalk, proceed to exit driveway and onto Robinson Avenue.
- 4). There is no parking or student pick drop off between the Wilder driveways on Robinson Avenue.

After School Pick Up Procedures;

- 1). All Wilder students exit the building at 2:45 pm and proceed to the front of the building crossing over the buss drive through onto the landing pad adjacent to Robinson Avenue. The landing pad is where parents may wait for the child(ren) to pick them up. Any student needing to be picked up before 2:45 pm, parents/legal guardians must report to the Wilder office for pick up.
- 2). There is no parking or student pick up between the Wilder driveways on Robinson Avenue.

Thank you in advance for following the above drop off/pick up procedures as this will help ensure everyone's safety at these busy times.

## **CHAMPS**

Wilder School will continue to implement a classroom management framework called CHAMPS this school year. Each of our learning environments will use the CHAMPS Framework that we will continue to learn through professional development during the 2018-19 school year. CHAMPS is a proactive and positive approach to classroom management. It ties in with our PBIS school wide system.

The focus within this framework is on prevention and on teaching expectations to students. Direct instruction will be provided so that our students behave responsibly in each major activity and transition. CHAMPS stands for: Conversation, Help, Activity, Movement, Participation, and Success. When students follow the CHAMPS expectations, it leads to success. I encourage you to ask your child about the CHAMPS expectations in their classrooms.

## **NEW - Online Registration**

New this school year, families are encouraged to save time and paperwork at back-to-school registration by visiting the Infinite Campus parent portal prior to school starting. Parents/guardians can take care of annual updates regarding student demographic information such as phone numbers, email addresses and emergency contacts.

Update your information online without filling out forms for each child or waiting in long lines at school.

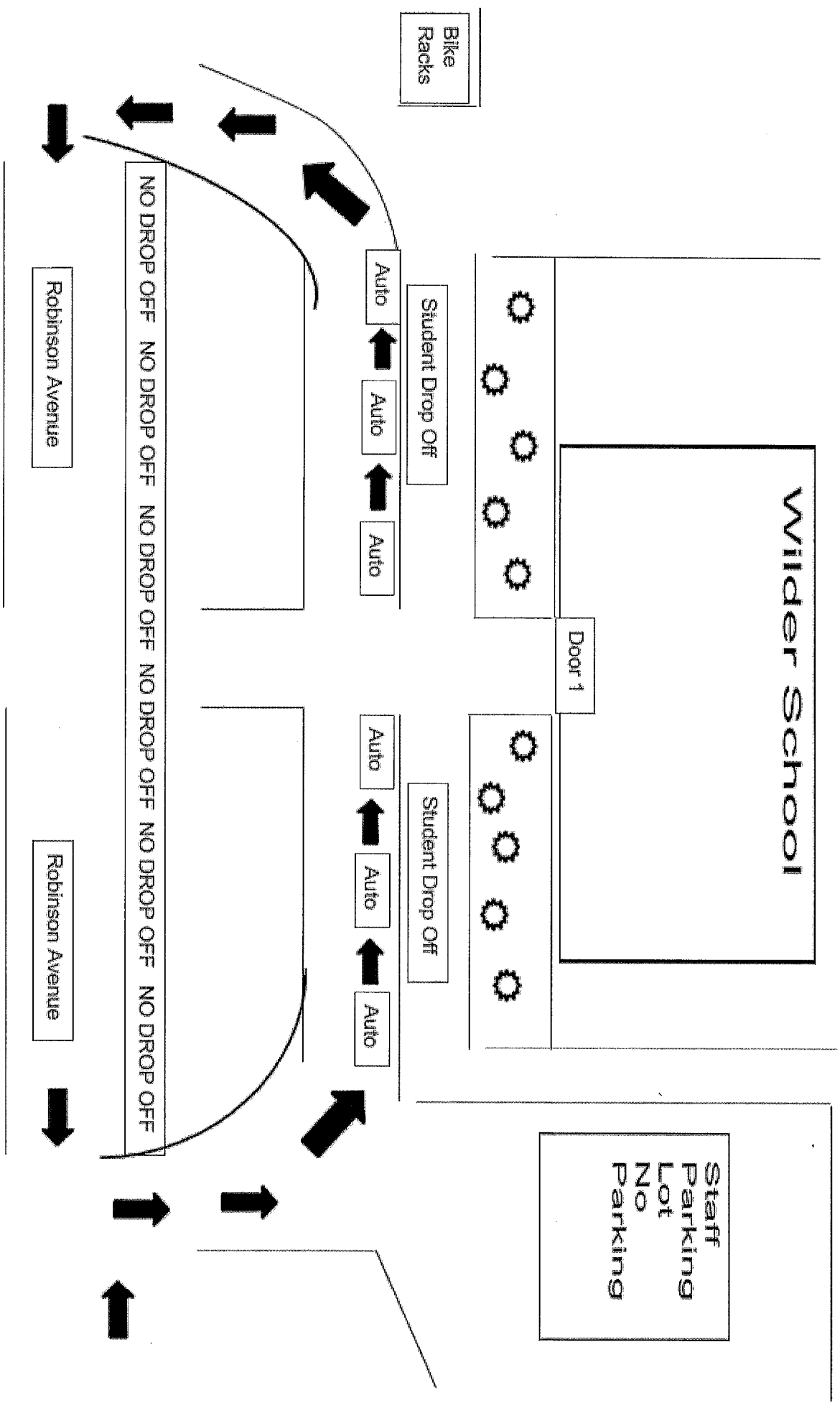

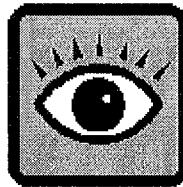

## Wilder Elementary Hearing & Vision Screening Dates



The Brown County Health Department staff will be coming to **Wilder Elementary** to provide Hearing and Vision Screenings for the designated grades and other requested students.

The Hearing Screening will occur on **Tuesday, September 25, 2018**. All 4K (located only within schools that have other designated grades already being screened), 5K and 1st graders, any new students to the district, and any students requested by teachers or parents/guardians will be tested. If your child does not pass the initial hearing screening, a rescreen will be performed in four to six weeks to determine if there is a persistent hearing problem. If they still do not pass, a letter will be sent home indicating the importance of following up with a physician and/or audiologist. The screening is not a substitute for a regular examination by your physician but is meant to identify persistent hearing loss in children and bring it to the attention of parents/guardians and teachers.

The Vision Screening will occur on **Tuesday October 23, 2018**. All 4K (located only within schools that have other designated grades already being screened), 5K, 1st, 3rd, 5th graders, any new students to the district, and any students requested by teachers and parents/guardians will be tested. Vision screening routinely tests distance vision. A photo-refractor tool is used with students in the targeted grades, as well as with requested students. The photo-refractor takes a reading of the child's eyes and could possibly detect some problems with the eye that we cannot detect through our traditional screening methods. If your child already wears glasses, they will be tested with their glasses on to make sure the glasses are working properly. Near vision and color vision can be tested upon request only. The screening methods used can detect several eye problems common to these age groups. However, the screening provided by Brown County Health Department should not be a substitute for a complete professional eye exam. A child who passes may still have other visual problems. If symptoms such as squinting, headaches, frowning, or frequent blinking are noted, a complete eye exam is recommended. Red, swollen or encrusted eyelids indicate a medical problem requiring a physician's treatment. If your child does not pass the screening, a letter will be sent home recommending an examination by an eye doctor. **Prevent Blindness** recommends that children have a professional eye exam prior to entering school and up to every other year after that.

**IMPORTANT:** Brown County Health Department will inform your child's school and teacher if your child does not pass either/both screenings and a letter will be sent home as well. Screening staff will only be sending detailed results to the "School Nurse or Dedicated Health Professional", in accordance with HIPAA and due to PHI (Protected Health Information) contained in the reports

**PARENTS:** Parental consent is not required for students to participate in the above screenings. However, if you **DO NOT** want your child screened for hearing and/or vision **YOU MUST** contact your child's school at least one week prior to the screening date to have your child removed from the screening list. It is the school's responsibility to inform health department staff of any students who should not be included in the screening(s).
