Greetings Wilder Families

Have you heard of the Zones of Regulation? I will be introducing The Zones to students this month. The Zones curriculum helps students identify their emotional state and whether or not their body is regulated so that they are able to learn. As a school, we are working towards using a common language with all students to provide learning opportunities and awareness towards their own self-regulation.

Self-Regulation is also known as self-control, self-management, anger control, or impulse control. Self-Regulation describes a person's ability to adjust their level of alertness and how they display their emotions.

Not only can this learning benefit our students, but it is beneficial learning for everyone! As we progress through our learning of the Zones of Regulation, it is important to note that there is no such thing as a "bad zone." We all experience all of the Zones in our life.

I will continue to share information with you around the Zones of Regulation so you can learn along with your child/children. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions or concerns about the Zones of Regulation.




Isolate for 10 days
